## Whitstable Junior School Facebook Page...



WJS will be launching its Facebook Page after Christmas. Kent County Council recommends that no schools create closed groups but instead use pages to communicate with their own communities. We would like our page to be used as an ongoing newsfeed. We do not want to totally restrict the page as we feel one of the benefits of a Facebook page is that extended family can view the events of the school and see what their grandchildren/nephews/nieces etc. have been doing from further afield. It also enables us to spread requests for help or advertising for open days and allows our school community to see the wonderful things that are happening at Whitstable Juniors on a regular basis.

As Headteacher, I am the lead member of staff who posts and monitors the page and only members of the Senior Leadership team have administration rights. We have thoroughly risk assessed the use of Facebook and we are following Local Authority guidelines on ensuring anything that is shared is safe and within acceptable parameters. Safeguarding is our primary concern and our policy guidelines around acceptable use of images are very clear. No

images of children will feature their full name and we will only use images of children who we have consent for. We would like to remind parents that any social media including Facebook is a public domain. Posts from the school Facebook page will not appear on people's news feed unless they have actively sought us out and "liked" the page. Posts to the school Facebook page can be viewed much the same as anything the school displays on the school website. We would like to make sure that we work in partnership with our school community to ensure that the school Facebook page is used safely and responsibly. With Internet use becoming an essential feature of everyday life it is important that all members of the school community are aware that online conduct can have a significant impact both within and outside of school. We hope you look forward to having another means of seeing what is happening in your children's school.
