Changes to homework...

New Homework System for 2019!

The new academic year brings with it our new approach to homework. It is so important to us to ensure that we get the balance right for all of our families so we have made important changes to the homework expectations.

Enjoyment of learning and improving key skills is always our focus so children will be expected to **practice their target times-tables** using TTRockstars, **learn their focus spellings for the week** using Spelling Shed and **read every day**.

There will also be an **Optional Homework Grid**, sent out every new term, which gives children an opportunity to complete fun and inspiring activities that are linked to reading, PSHEE (Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education) or their current topic theme.

Children will have a **Homework Book** that will include: the **Optional Homework Grid**, their timetables and the spellings for the term so that they can be practiced without the online sites should IT not be available. These books can be handed in every week should any of the **Optional Homework** activities have been completed. Please record when your child practices their times tables, spellings and reads in their **Contact Books which should be in school every day**.

Your child's SpellingShed and TTRockstars logins will be at the front of their contact books early next week. These are different to previous versions last year.

For TTRockstars the children will need to set their ROCK SPEED in the studio section. This involves playing 10 completed goes to set their new speed for their new year group.

Spelling tests will be on **Friday** so the children have to week to revise the words through the week. A termly overview will be in the children's homework books.



Our Carrot reward system will also be starting on Monday. You and your child can monitor points by visiting <https://www.mystickers.co.uk/>. We are linking these to our new drivers: adventure, independence, curiosity, resilience, community and challenge. The children will have more information about this in Monday's assembly.

If you have any problems, let the office know and we will try to resolve these as soon as we can.

Clubs Information...

Clubs will start on Thursday 19th September. You will receive a letter next week which will provide you with a web address to access the club booking system. Follow the instructions on screen and then you will be able to book clubs. If the club is full you will be unable to book a place. If you can then your child has a place on that club.

Please ensure that you phone the office to let us know if your child is not going to attend a club they have been booked onto. We can then inform the member of staff and when they take the register they won't be alarmed that your child is not there.

Clubs are run by staff on a voluntary basis. This means that there are some occasions when they have to be cancelled. Therefore I would urge you not to use clubs as child care because of this.

Animal "Creepy Claws" Club is a club run at school by an external provider. A letter will be coming to you on Monday. You need to contact them directly to book a place and make payments. School is not involved with the administration of this club.
