Dear Parents and Carers,

An interesting week at WJS with Friday proving VERY interesting!! However we have made it and we hope we have photographed all the children who were here in school today.

This week we had the pleasure of listening to Wayne about his travels around the coastline of Britain and his quest to pick up as much litter as possible. He was truly inspirational and his lovely dog Koda was a delight too. I know Wayne inspired the children because I had children bringing litter through the gates to put in our bins that they had found on their journey to school.

The staff all had training after school at Quex Park Forest School. This was a fabulous opportunity to learn new skills so that we will be able to build more outdoor learning opportunities into the children's lessons. There has been lots of exciting activity in Lower School this week. Year 3 have made good use of our outdoor learning areas by investigating different rocks and soils, challenging themselves to build Stonehenge from natural materials and generally having lots of fun and adventure in our "micro" Forest School. Year 4 have also been doing some outside learning by embarking on an alien hunt for clues after the mysterious spaceship appeared this morning in St Alphege playground. They have also been learning about changing states by carrying out an investigation involving honey and salad cream races! Year 5 have had fun in literacy writing letters from people who might have been on the beach (from the book Flotsam), they have done this with photos which were taken at a range of different time periods (Victorians, 50s, 60, 90s and today). They have actively explored our coasts during a very sunny trip on Thursday, using their literacy, art, maths and geography skills. They have also measured the gradient of the beach, the PH levels of the water, looked at the types of stones and waves and discussed the different land uses as they walked down - a very successful trip! They were very fortunate for such good weather and created sea art and poetry as well. In science, they have been investigating dissolving and have experimented with candyfloss to see how it dissolves. Did they create a dissolving solution or not? All will be revealed next week!

Year 6 have continued their epic journey exploring the Amazon, through the wonderful book 'The Explorers', they even got to enjoy a delicious pineapple just as the children in the story did. Maths has been fun, reinforcing their addition and subtraction skills through games and problem solving. During science, they have been researching the lives of key scientists who were famous for discovering and creating their classification system-such an amazing discovery! They also began reading Harry Potter which has delighted all of our Harry Potter fans!


