## What are we learning about this term?




#### Key Areas covered this term in Maths

In Maths lessons, we will be starting the term looking at multiplication and division. We will then be applying our skills to learn about











#### Times tables

In Year 3, we work hard on learning our times tables and regularly check on the progress we make. TTRockstars is great for learning tables and improving speed. Any practice at home would be a great help.

#### Key Areas covered this term in English

At WJS, we use a programme called Read, Write Inc, which supports children with reading and phonics. This is taught in small groups within the Literacy sessions. This term, we will be looking at story entitled 'Storm'. The children listen to the story and predict what may happen at various points. They focus on character, setting and mood, asking questions as the story progresses and locating evidence in the text to answer specific questions. They will learn how descriptive sentences are important and how a setting affects the mood. In grammar and punctuation, we will revise and develop punctuating direct speech and then work on nouns, adjectives and expanded noun phrases. Our second unit is Shape Poetry. In this unit, the children learn about and enjoy reading calligrams before writing their own.

Reading at home: We encourage children to read as often as possible. We have challenged all of year 3 to aim to complete the bronze bookmark by Christmas!

**Spellings:** Each week we look at a new spelling rule and will spend time each day doing spelling activities. Our weekly test is on a Friday. Spelling Shed is a fun way that children can play games and learn spellings at home.





#### France, French, Nativity and PE:





During term 2 the children will be seeking adventure by flying (via Google Earth) to France! We will be looking at where France is located and its relationship to the United Kingdom. On our journey around France, we will identify physical and human characteristics whilst comparing these with the UK. Our journey continues by comparing and contrasting the two capital cities of Paris and London. To kick off our new topic, we will be having an exciting French Café will take place where the children can sample some traditional French cuisine. To end our journey, the children will create their own French travel brochures. Maybe they will even be able to persuade you to go on holiday to France! The children will also be continuing to learn how to introduce themselves and count in French through exciting and engaging activities such as games and songs. During other lessons children will be developing their co-ordination, and fitness through dance and rugby.

We also have the wonderful opportunity to perform a Nativity play to the school and to families. We will be practicing hard and look forward to performing on Wednesday I I<sup>th</sup> December at 2.15pm and again on Thursday I 2<sup>th</sup> December at 6pm. #### PHSE:

In PSHE, we will be exploring community and the concept of fairness. In addition to this we will also be holding an Anti-Bullying week where children will be learning about the risks online and how to keep themselves safe through lots of engaging activities, games and film clips. We hope this will help the children to forge new friendships as they continue their journey through Whitstable Junior School.
