What are we learning about this term?



Key Areas covered this term in Maths:





Multiplication and Division:

We are starting our investigations into Multiples and using this to find Factors, Common Factors, Prime Numbers, Square Numbers and Cube Numbers. We will investigate multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000 and understanding multiples of 10, 100 and 1000s.

Then moving on to revising multiplying 4 digit by I digit, Year 5 will look at the next step. We will be multiplying by 2/3 and 4 digit numbers by 2 digit numbers. Next, we will look at 4 digit by I digit with remainders. Using all our new mathematical knowledge, we will apply our understand to many different forms of problem solvings.

Measure Area and Perimeter:

We will measure and calculate the perimeter of rectangular shapes in centimetres and/or metres and find the area of compound and irregular shapes.

Key Areas covered this term in English:



Ultimate Explorers

In this unit, the children explore the Big Question:

What makes someone a great explorer?

They research challenges foced by explorers

They research challenges faced by explorers, through a variety of sources, understand and explain different viewpoints and look for evidence about what qualities successful explorers would need. The children will then use this to create a guide to being an astronaut to link with our space topic.

Ultimate Rap!



In this unit they will write and perform their own raps. As a class, they listen to some raps and poems and learn about the differences between rap and poetry.

Spellings:

Don't forget Spelling and Spelling Shed. The new rule will be introduced on a Monday, with a set of spellings sent home to learn, ready for a test on Friday.







North America, Space, RE, D and T, Music, French and Art:



Geography - North America

We will be exploring the continent of North America, learning about the different countries, the states of the USA and famous landmarks. We will also be exploring human and physical features and comparing countries to the UK.

Science - Space

In this unit, pupils will describe the movement of Earth, and other planets, relative to the Sun in our Solar System. They will describe the movement of the Moon relative to Earth and describe the Sun, Earth and the Moon as approximately spherical bodies. Pupils will use the idea of Earth's rotation to explain day and night and the apparent movement of the Sun across the sky. They will also have the opportunity to find out how ideas about the solar system have developed and changed over time.

Religious Studies -

If God is everywhere – why go to a place of worship?

Pupils will learn in depth from different religious and spiritual ways of life about worship, drawing out more detail, history and diversity through focussing on places of worship. They will learn about the various purposes of a place of worship as well as how believers see these places.

D and T - Luna Rovers

The children will be developing their design and making skill by producing a model of a vehicle that could be used to explore a planet or moon's surface.

French - Mon Ecole

This term we will continue with Mon Ecole with a real focus on school subjects and applying them to our classroom lessons.

Music

We will be listening to a range of music linked to our space and North America theme. Later, we will be learning songs for Christmas
