## A message from the Headteacher...

Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to term 4. The weather has certainly been dreary and grey but life at WJS continues to be exhilarating and fun.

Year 3 have been excited to begin studying the book "Into the Forest" by Anthony Browne. So far they have predicted the story and acted out a scene from the book to think about the emotions and thoughts of the main characters. They have been putting their measuring skills to the test in Maths, converting mm and cms. They have also researched the life and works of Vincent van Gogh and worked to produce posters of information. They looked closely at his painting style and tried to create their own versions of his famous painting Starry Night.

This week, Year 4 began preparations for their upcoming soirée! For this, children had the opportunity to audition any hidden talents they may have in front of the whole year group - they were all truly brilliant, well done!

Year 5 have spent their first week back, exploring the amazing poem by Homer: 'The Odyssey'. The children have loved learning about the start of the adventures that Odysseus and his crew had after Troy. In RE, they have been studying Judaism and exploring the difference between Orthodox and Reform Synagogues; the children had great fun practicing writing out the Torah. Finally, the teachers have told me how amazing it has been to see the progress the children have made during their swimming lessons and what fun it has been getting back into the pool.

Year 6 have begun their gruesome lessons all about Crime and Punishment through the ages: this week they learnt about how the Romans dealt with criminals. The children were quite amazed that in Roman times if they did not keep the front of their house clean then this was seen as a crime and could be punished by flogging or beating! Children have also been having fun with numbers- amazing themselves at how quickly they have been able to find a rule and apply this to solve the nth term! Amazing! This week we have also asked all the children, parents, carers, staff and governors what they think about changing the school House names.
