## **MUSIC TASK**

LI: To make music using objects you can find around your home.

TASK: Watch <a href="https://www.bbc.co.uk/programmes/p00yygjx">https://www.bbc.co.uk/programmes/p00yygjx</a>, a short video which shows how music can be made using everyday objects or even recycling!

Make a list of everyday objects found around your home that you could use for percussion purposes (musical objects played by striking with a hand or beater) and then have a go at exploring which different sounds they make.



1. Keys they make a clinging sound.



2. Cereal make a crunch crunch sound



3. Bear with stuffed grains.



4. Brush makes a brush noise.



5. Glass and spoon makes a clinking sound.

Try changing your banging instrument (e.g. metal spoon/ wooden spoon/ lolly stick etc) and see if this affects the sound. Does it make a higher sound/ deeper sound? Is it a louder sound or quieter sound?

We used three different materials to bang the side of the glass.

The bamboo fork sounded more high pitched but quiet.

The plastic spoon sounded louder and more aggressive.

The metal spoon sounded the same volume, but sharp.
