A message from the Headteacher...

Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been a busy week again at WJS. I hope you have been able to use the tab on our website to keep up to date with any information coming from the government regarding the Coronavirus. There is a separate section on the newsletter below giving the most recent guidance.

This week Year 3 have been investigating how plants transport water by putting celery in food dye and recreating the capillary action of plants using kitchen paper. RE was really exciting as they used musical instruments and drama to recreate the story of Moses and Passover for the Jewish festival of Pesach. In art they looked at the artist Kandinsky and used the music of Wagner to inspire their artwork.

Year 4 have enjoyed making Roman shields in Design Technology to protect themselves in battle! They have also been learning about how and why the Romans built roads and how some of these roads are still used today. Two of the year 4 classes have also enjoyed a day at Quex Park Manor House Forest School. Upper school have been having a fantastic time this week with Year 5 immersing themselves in ancient history and the lives of the Greek Gods through making delicious Greek salads and then writing a debate entitled: 'Would you rather be an unhappy person or happy pig?' inspired by their class book The Odyssey. They have explored keeping themselves safe online through learning about 'Strong Passwords' using the menti-meter in class. Year 6, have completed their amazing year group, Jackson Pollock inspired artwork. They have learnt about the life of Dick Turpin during their Crime and Punishment lessons and also visited the local Whitstable museum to learn all about the first steam train that is on display there.

We have also sent out a letter this week about our aim to build a Living Wall with the children in Term 5. We desperately need plants to fill the recycled bottles we have collected for this. We are ideally looking for hardy perennials that will attract butterflies, bugs and add fragrance to our outdoor learning space. If you are able to contribute a plant please bring it either to the office or by way of your child to Mrs Migden in class 5M by 27th March 2020. Huge thanks in advance for helping contribute to our school's natural environment.
