

Then we went home and called Jean and she wanted to ask lots of questions about us.



Stag Beetle Spotted!

This Stag Beetle was spotted in Whitstable this week by Lily and her parents.



Here is some information about Stag Beetles that you might like to know.

Keep your eyes peeled for them on your walks!

Stag beetles are one of the most spectacular insects in the UK. The Male's large jaws look just like the antlers of a stag. Adult males vary in size from 35mm to 75 mm long and tend to be seen flying at dusk in the summer looking for a mate.

Stag beetles spend most of their life underground as larvae, only coming out for a few weeks in the summer to find a mate and reproduce. Stag beetles and their larvae are quite harmless and are a joy to watch.


The adult's head and thorax (middle section) are shiny black and its wing cases are chestnut brown.

Cleo's Gluten Free Victoria Sponge Mug Cakes

Ingredients

For the cakes (makes 4)

2 large egg

100 ml vegetable or rapeseed oil, (plus extra for greasing)

100 g self-raising gluten free flour

100 g caster sugar

1 tsp vanilla extract

For the frosting:

30 g unsalted butter, (room temperature)

80 g icing sugar

2 tsp milk

2 to 4 drops vanilla extract

4 tsp strawberry jam or raspberry jam

2 to 4 tbsp icing sugar (for dusting)

You will need 4 mugs, 2 mixing bowls, a knife, a fork, a mixing spoon, 2 teaspoons, and a tea strainer or sieve.

Method

- **1.** Dip kitchen towel in the oil and grease the mug.
- **2.** Pour all of the cake ingredients into the bowl and mix together with a fork or spoon so it is light and fluffy.
- **3.** Pour the mixture evenly into 4 mugs.
- **4.** Put the cakes individually into the microwave for 70 seconds.
- **5.** Leave each cake to stand for 1 minute then run a knife round the inside of the mug to loosen the cake before tipping it out onto a plate.
- **6.** Cut each cake in half horizontally.
- **7.** Make the frosting: put the butter, sugar, milk and vanilla extract into the second bowl then mix them together until it forms a spreadable icing.
- **8.** Spread jam on one side and the icing on the other then put them together.
- **9.** sieve the icing sugar onto the top of the cakes.

If you like you can put a piece of

fruit on top maybe the same as the type of jam you used.

Isla's Unicorn Crispy Squares

Makes 24 small squares

Ingredients

45g Butter300g Mini Marshmallows180g Rice KrispiesEdible Glitter or Sprinkles (optionals)



Directions

- 1. Melt the butter in a large, heavy saucepan over a low heat.
- 2. Add the marshmallows and cook gently until they are completely melted and blended stirring all the time.
- 3. Take the pan off the heat and immediately add the cereal and mix lightly until its all coated.
- 4. Press the mixture into Put all of the ingredients into a greased 32cm x 23cm tin. Warning! It will be very sticky! Press it into the corners of the tin as best you can, flatten the top and add your glitter or sprinkles.
- 5. Leave it to cool completely and then cut into 24 squares.



How to Make Whitstable Sea Salt

What you will need:

- Bottles that add up to 5 ½ litres
- Funnel
- Reusable plastic cup
- Salt water from the sea at low tide
- Large cooking pot
- Stove
- Container to put the salt in



Method:



- 1. At low tide find the small running streams that run down to the sea and gently try to collect as clear water as possible with the plastic reusable cup trying to get as little sand and muck as possible. Then put the water in the bottles with the funnel and put the lids on top.
- 2. Back at home put the bottles of water into the large cooking pot and place on the stove. If you haven't got a big enough pot, keep on adding the rest of the water little by little as the water in the pot evaporates.
- 3. Let the water to evaporate and once there is only a couple of inches of water left, pour it in a rectangular container and as if by magic, the salt crystals will start to form.
- 4. You will see that the pot has some salt left on the bottom that has sand and muck in it. Scrape it off and throw it away.
- 5. Gently take the salt out of the container and put it drying on paper towel. Return the remaining water back to the pot, and gently heat up, and you will see clean salt crystals forming again. Now that your salt water is clean, you can carry on collecting the salt from the pot, and heating the water again and collect the salt crystals as they form.





- 6. Keep on putting the salt on the paper towel and spread it, so it will dry. I left it on the salt drying on the paper towels overnight, and it was nice and dry in the morning.
- 7. Then put it in a glass container and if you want to be fancy you can label it, so that everyone knows it's from Whitstable. I have used it in my cooking, and really is salty, but nice.
- 8. There you have it you've made your very own salt straight from the seas of Whitstable!

Make a Bird Feeder!

What you will need:

- An empty clean can
- •A coloured ribbon (I recommend lace), minimum width of 1.5 inches
- Coloured waterproof paints
- •A thick stick, the thickness of a pencil approximately
- Seeds for birds



Method:

- 1. Paint a base coat on the can so that there is no reflection on it anymore, so that the birds won't get scared. Give it two or three coats of paint, letting it dry in between the coats.
- 2. After the paint has dried, paint on whatever pattern you like and leave it to dry
- 3. Then tie your ribbon round the can, in the middle, so that it isn't wonky
- 4.Glue the stick on the inside of the bird feeder but make sure that it sticks out so the birds can perch on the stick, whilst they munch their food.
- 5. Pop the seeds in and you are ready go and hang that bird feeder up and admire your great work. It really is fun to watch the birds visiting the feeder
