
We also saw the Penguins whose enclosure super stinky. I really enjoyed taking photos of all the animals with my I pad.

What to do if you find a live seal

If you find a seal on a beach, **watch it from a distance**. **Do not approach** the animal or allow children or dogs near it. Seals are wild animals and although they look cute, they will defend themselves aggressively if necessary.

Seals regularly haul out on our coasts and finding a seal on the beach does not mean there is necessarily a problem. After stormy weather and / or high tides, seals will come to beaches to rest and regain their strength. **Do not chase it into the sea** as this may stop it from doing what it needs to do – rest.

If you see a seal that may be abandoned, thin, ill or injured do not approach. Call for advice and assistance:



I really liked this movie because there are 2 main characters a really posh 9 year old named Allisa Callaway and a 9 year old orphan called Amanda Lemmon.


Amanda Lemmon is a 9 year old orphan she is a very fun character because she is very cheeky, isn't scared of anything and doesn't care what anyone thinks.

This well thought out book contains imaginative characters such as Ned, the coolest kid on wheels - also this fantastic book's main character. Ned's, as you might say, co-star or supporting act 'Slime' has a funny personality. He was concocted in a bathtub and meant to be a surprise for Ned's evil gunk hiding sister Jemima! All these amazing characters live on the dreaded island of Mulch where children hating adults storm around the streets. Follow Ned and Slime on their daring adventure, seeking revenge on the adults of Mulch for their reckless behaviour.

HOW TO MAKE SLIME!

Makes 1 small ball/ Takes 10 minutes

Ingredients

- 100ml PVA white glue (children's craft glue)
- 1/2 tsp bicarbonate of soda
- gel food colouring
- 1 tsp contact lens cleaning solution
- Googly eyes (optional)

Method

1. Squeeze the glue into a mixing bowl (look for a bottle in a 100ml size if possible so you won't have to measure it out). Add the bicarbonate of soda and mix well.
2. Add a drop or two of your chosen gel food colouring. Less colouring gives a pastel colour; the more you add, the brighter the colour. Mix until well incorporated.
3. Add the contact lens solution and mix. The slime will begin to form, going stringy before coming away clean from the bowl into a ball.
4. Once it has formed, take it out and knead it with your hands. It will be sticky at first but after about 30 seconds you'll have a smooth squishy slime ball. Add googly eyes at this point, if you like, and work in with your hands. Store in a pot with a lid. And there you have it your very own slime!






Trying a Triathlon by Cecily



This weekend I competed in a triathlon. It was a virtual one, which meant I had to choose the course for myself. It was a 200m swim, a 4km bike leg and a 1km run. I raced in the 8-10 year old category and raised money for Macmillan cancer support.

Beforehand I felt nervous and apprehensive, as it was my first time doing a triathlon. It was also my first time swimming in the sea, although I had swum the distance during my lessons in the pool. I was worried and anxious because of my breathing on the run.

The first thing I had to do was the swim. It was a very windy day and the sea was very rough. There were lots of waves and I swallowed lots of water, which tasted salty and horrible. I could not see where I was going and I had nothing to hold on to when I got tired. Afterwards I was completely exhausted.

The next day was the bike. It was sunny and I cycled along the sea front to Hampton. We went early so there weren't many people around and I could go fast.

The run came last. On Sunday, I ran around the Westmeads rec for 1km. It was tiring and I got a stitch but it didn't stop me.

Afterwards I submitted all of my times. I was pleased to have finished after having done all three disciplines. They weren't as bad I had feared and it has not put me off doing another one.



How to Win at Windsurfing!




Over lockdown I've been learning to windsurf and I would like to share with you what I've learnt.

We used a Starboard Start board and a Mistral kids' rig (which is the sail, the mast and the boom.)

1. Rig the sail, mast and boom, but that's too complicated to describe here so ask me if you want to know how to do it.
2. Carry the board and rig down to the sea. This is difficult so ask an adult for assistance.
3. Connect the rig to the board with something called a UJ (a universal joint).
4. You're ready to go. Put the board in the water but make sure the fin at the bottom isn't touching the sea bed.
5. Get on the board and stand in the centre of the board with your feet either side of the mast foot.
6. Pull up the rig using the elastic that is attached to the boom. This is called the uphaul.
7. When the sail comes out of the water hold onto the uphaul and make sure you feel comfortable. This is called the ready position.
8. Now you put your forward hand on the boom and place your feet one right next to the mast foot and one close to the back of the board. Now you can put your back hand on the boom as well. Pull the sail in (sheet in) and you should be up and running. But you might fall off a lot.

TOP TIPS - WOODWORK!

At homeschool we have been doing woodwork lessons.

Steps (you will need a adult to help):

1. Take 2 long straight pieces of old wood of even sizes and lengths.
2. Cut the longest piece into two parts to make the top and bottom.
3. Cut the shorted piece in two to make the sides.
4. Attach the sides to the base with metal brackets held together with screws.
5. Attach the roof to the sides by screwing two large screws downwards.
6. Diagonally screw a metal screw on each of the sides to hook on a hammock.
7. Get a square piece of fabric (I used some of an old daddy shirt) to create the hammock tying with string at each end.
8. Attach to screws to create hammock.
9. Create furniture with any left over small bits of thin wood. I made a chair and table which were made by screwing wood together and screwing it to the base.
10. Finally I screwed in metal hooks at the side to hang my doll's clothes on (Rachel)
11. Now your doll can hang! Get the joke?

Planet Mercury

Mercury is a planet which is 58 million km from the sun. That sounds like a long way from the sun but actually Mercury is the closest planet to the sun. In midday temperatures it can be +430C, and at night time -170C. To approach Mercury enormous speed is needed, flying past the planet three times, to approach Mercury. It was discovery of relatively large concentration of potassium and sulphur.




Fast Facts


- Mercury is the closest planet to the Sun.
- Mercury's day (the length of time it takes to orbit the Sun) is 88 Earth days.
- Temperatures range from well below zero on the surface to nearly 800F on the sunlit side of the planet.
- There are deposits of ice at the poles of Mercury, in places where sunlight is never seen.
- The MESSENGER spacecraft provided detailed maps and images of Mercury's surface.
