A fabulous week of fun and learning all rolled into one. Lots of outdoor adventures at the beach, in our own "micro-forest school"...



... and also a visit to Quex Park Forest School for 5T who missed out on their trip in Year 4.



Year 6 children have been having a great time this week as they explored the Amazon Rainforest in even more detail when they had the unique opportunity to virtually interview one of our parents who had actually visited the rainforest. The children were in awe of her stories and mind-blowing facts, reinforced with amazing photographs of the wildlife and surroundings. We are so grateful to have such wonderful parents and carers supporting us. Thank you Kerry I heard so much about it from the children.

This week year 5 have had a wonderful time doing all manner of fun activities: they have written a letter to parliament; 5T were lucky enough to go to forest school while 5M went to the beach. In maths, they have been discovering the intricacies of Roman Numerals-perhaps if you spot any Roman Numerals out and about you could ask them if they can tell you what number the numerals represent. Year 3 have started reading about the adventures of George and the Dragon in the book Dragon Slayer. They have learned about the features of legends and used exciting vocabulary to describe the setting of where the beast lives. In RE this week, they sampled different types of bread and learned about how and why different Christians celebrate Holy Communion. In History, they became archaeologists and investigated an Iron Age bronze helmet that had been found on farmland in Canterbury. They made great historians and the lessons was definitely filled with lots of curiosity! This week year 4 have been conducting science experiments to find out about gas by using balloons! They have investigated the questions, does gas have a weight? What happens to gas when it is heated? And, can gas be made from a solid and a liquid?
