A message from the headteacher...

Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to term 5. I hope you all had a lovely Easter break. I know that we are all feeling refreshed and raring to go. We are all really looking forward to having 2 "normal" terms ahead of us. Fingers crossed.

The children have hit the ground running with their learning this term. Have a read below to get a flavour of what each year group has been up to. In year 4, 4O enjoyed the forest school. I went down to visit them in our lovely micro-forest school and was offered a wonderful pine cone salad, served up with a delicious mud dressing, all from a restaurant made that very afternoon out of bits of foraged wood! The children loved every moment of being there (marshmallow eating very much included) and the sun even made an appearance. The children have also been using personification and powerful verbs to write about erupting volcanoes.

Year 3 have started studying the book 'Into the Forest' By Anthony Browne. They have been looking at the main characters and how those characters are showing their feelings. They have enjoyed writing poems, character descriptions and doing some role play. In art, the children have been exploring the work of David Hockney who is an English painter, draftsman, printmaker, stage designer, and photographer.

Year 6 has started the new term full of enthusiasm and curiosity as they explore the writer's ability to create suspense and tension in their new class book: 'The Pig Heart Boy' by Malorie Blackman. The children have thoroughly enjoyed each lesson, as more of the storyline is revealed: day by day, chapter by chapter. They have shown great empathy as they write from the different character's points of view and discuss how they may solve the problems faced by the characters. In maths, the children have been developing their understanding of ratios, learning how to calculate and apply their understanding to problem-solving and how it can be used in real life. During RSE, the children have been exploring and discussing the fact that we are all entitled to our own opinions and how we can respect and embrace these differences.


Year 5 has got stuck into the vicious, blood-thirsty Vikings this week looking at their arrival at Lindisfarne, their God Thor, Asgard, and Valhalla. The children were surprised to learn about the respect they had for women and how they could be a warrior like a Shieldmaiden or were seen in myths like Valkyries and the Goddesses. The children have mastered multiplying tricky mixed number fractions and in art looked at the importance of line. While in French, they have started their journey into different school subjects. It has been a fascinating week!
