Year 5 have enjoyed being back together this week and are loving learning about Life Cycles watching newts, caterpillars and ladybirds grow in their science lessons. They discovered the music of Bollywood in their music lesson and were awestruck by the choreography and skill of the actors and musicians. Year 4 started the week by researching things to do and see in Canterbury and acted out being a tour guide. Throughout the
