### A message from the headteacher...

Dear Parents and Carers,

This week started with Meat Free Monday. It was fabulous to feel we were doing something to help combat the worries of climate change and we are looking forward to having that feeling every week. There was also a proud moment for some of our Year 6 children this week as they were presented with a book voucher and award for their entry into last year's competition based on 'improving our local environment'. They were



presented the award by local councillors: Cllr. Kenny and Cllr. Cornel and their entries will be on display in the Horsebridge. Well done to you all.



Year 5 have been busy this week getting very active. For Math's Week England,

they took part in the Mathematics World Cup competing against other classes and taking a deep dive into the ocean to solve some wonderful maths equations. They have also been outside measuring the tree trunks to calculate the age of the trees.



Year 6 has also thoroughly enjoyed their outdoor learning session; they

discovered that one of our trees was probably planted the same

year as the first man on the moon! The children have also begun their science topic about evolution



and inheritance, imagining what it might have been like to have been on earth as it was created! They have also loved being curious about the animals in the rainforest and have thoroughly enjoyed writing non-chronological reports about these wonderful creatures.

This term Year 4 are continuing with the theme of natural disasters. In literacy they have been reading the fantastic story, Hurricane, and exploring how it would feel to be in a weather plane flying into the eye of the storm! In maths the children have been working hard to understand the inverse operation to check their calculations and have shown great resilience. They have also looked at the different layers of the earth's core so that they can better understand what causes

natural disasters. Year 3 have been setting sail for France this week as they explored their new topic further through the creation of a non-chronological report in literacy. They did some excellent research in our ICT suite before creating some seriously impressive reports. They have been total stars; particularly during Year 2 workshops when they helped



Year 2 children with their activities and answered any questions they had.

On Remembrance Day Year 6 took the wreath they had made out to the cenotaph for the 2 minutes silence. They listened so respectfully to the readings and the last post. Then every child



at WJS took part in a remembrance ceremony. The children learnt about the connection between the herb rosemary and the flower pansy and Remembrance Day. They planted them in the timber trail area using the wonderful planters created by Year 6 last year and read the poem out loud. It was a very special day.
