We've made some amazing posters to adorn our pitch and it was incredible to see and hear the positive words being used to encourage each other whilst playing on there. "Banter as Bullying" was also a point of focus; enabling the children to recognise when what might seem harmless jokes becomes repetitive and unkind.

Year 5 have really loved the chance to develop their use of kind words making posters and discussing the

importance of thinking about banter and how this can be hurtful. In Geography, they have also been discovering countries in North America and learning about their flags. Whilst in Literacy, they have been looking at some of the females that were involved in the 'Space Race', such as Helen Sharman and Mary Jackson. Year 6 have loved being kind-recording messages to put on our school gate and making
