A message from the headteacher...

Dear Parents and Carers,

The whole school have been learning about special places and World Religion Day (WRD) which is celebrated every January on the third Sunday of the month. This year it is this coming Sunday, 16th of January. Its aim is to promote understanding and peace between all religions, encouraging people to learn about other faiths and their followers. The purpose of WRD is to work towards a peaceful

understanding between faiths. We are always striving to create a community that shows understanding and inclusivity and this really allows the children to do this.

Alongside learning about WRD the children have been enjoying a whole host of other exciting lessons.

Year 3 have enjoyed using our school atlases to learn more about cities. They also learnt about Hinduism for World Religion Day - focusing on the Hindu place of worship, a Mandir. They immersed themselves in the experience through a virtual tour and were inspired to create Mehndi patterns which they took so much pride and care in.

This week in Year 4 they have started designing their Roman catapults and thinking about the

materials they will need to build them. They have also been learning about the mighty Boudicca! In science they have been looking at the digestive system and what happens to their food after they have eaten it. They have learnt lots of exciting new words like oesophagus! In literacy they have finished writing about the devastation of Pompeii and in maths we have been working hard learning our 11 and 12 times tables and applying them to multiplication problems. For World



Religion Day they looked at the special places in the Islamic faith and created some wonderful Islamic

patterns.

Year 5 have been busy learning fascinating facts about the gross, hairy and atrocious Minotaur, as well as mastering multiplying by 2-digit numbers and applying this new skill to word problems. As it is World Religion Day on Sunday, the children visited St Alphege Church and explored this sacred place of worship.

In year 6, the children have been continuing to develop their skills of debating. This time understanding how to produce a balanced-counter argument; they have thoroughly enjoyed some rather heated debates!

The Headteacher Award goes to someone who is a fantastic role model to his peers in both his attitude and resilience for learning. COVID Update...

From Monday 17 January, people who are self-isolating with COVID-19 will have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with a lateral flow device (LFD) test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature. For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to their education or childcare setting immediately on day 6. The first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the self-isolation period, and the second must be taken the following day (no less than 24 hours later). It remains that currently if the LFD test is positive and your child is asymptomatic then you no longer need to confirm this with a PCR.

If your child tests positive, their self-isolation period begins on the day their symptoms started or the day they had the test (we call this day 0) and the **next** 10 full days **unless** they test negative on LFDs on day 5 and 6. If they continue to test positive, they can only leave self-isolation after they have completed the full 10 days.
