

A message from the headteacher...

Dear Parents and Carers,



This week has seen the children take a trip through time at WJS.

Year 5 really enjoyed looking at how our school building has changed over the decades. They found out the windows had been specifically designed to be high up so that children would not be able to look out and stop working! They also found out that we used to have a school magazine. We had some fabulous costumes come into school when the children dressed up in World War 2 outfits and then wrote about the experiences of a wartime evacuee.

Year 6 have focused on life at school as a Victorian child and thoroughly enjoyed taking part in a day in the life of a Victorian child: from roll calls, hand inspections, wearing a Dunce's hat and having to stand when an adult entered the room; every part of the day made them appreciate their current school experiences - but I know they will not forget the day! They also learned to write with a quill and learned a lot about our beautiful Victorian building. In Year 4 they looked at how the school has changed over the last 100 years and thought about how the children's lives 100 years ago would be different to their lives today. They have been learning about

#### Attendance...

Unfortunately, we are starting to see more requests for term time holidays and requests to take children out of school. These are always unauthorised unless it is exceptional circumstances.

Regular attendance is extremely important to help your child achieve, reach their highest potential and give them the 'flying start' they deserve. Research shows that missing school can have a huge impact on a child's education and by law, all children of compulsory school age (between 5 and 16) must receive a suitable full-time education. As a <u>parent, you have a legal responsibility</u> to make sure this happens and as a school, we are required by the Government to inform parents/carers when their child's attendance falls below 90%. Attendance below 95% is deemed as

unsatisfactory and below 90% a cause for concern. Good attendance is 98% or better. Your child's attendance is monitored carefully and daily by our attendance officer.

Below is a poster that breaks down the attendance percentages and really shows how the odd days can add up! Therefore, you need to ensure that your child attends <u>regularly</u> and <u>punctually</u>. Even arriving just 5 minutes late per day will add up to 3 days of lost school time!

We always endeavour to be sensitive to needs and personal circumstances and strive to work together to resolve any concerns and to offer our support in any way we can. However, in the circumstances attendance does not show significant improvement (in individual cases) we will arrange a meeting to discuss your child's attendance further and there is the possibility of fines.
