


#### A message from the headteacher...

Dear Parents and Carers,

The week started in a glorious blaze of yellow when we could all wear yellow for World Mental Health Day. You raised £65.70 for YoungMinds. Thank you so much.

It has also been Black History Week for all children. This is such a wonderful week for us and the children have really enjoyed all that they have done. Year 4 have been planning their very own creation story in literacy, based on the incredible myths we have been reading in class. They have also been working hard in maths, doing column addition with exchanging. As part of black history



In Year 5 children have very much enjoyed being problem-solving detectives, using methods to visualise and calculate tricky multi-step problems based on the skills of addition and subtraction. As it has been Black History Week, the children have loved learning about Barack Obama and Louis Armstrong. In literacy, they have continued using persuasive techniques when writing about plastic pollution. Do we have the next Greta Thunberg or David Attenborough in our midst?

The children in Year 6 have been exploring the history of slavery through first-hand sources of evidence, ranging from the middle passage, life as a slave, and the civil rights



movements. They demonstrated their understanding by creating drama and writing a diary entry. They have also looked at the inspirational life of Harriet Tubman and Marcus Rashford and how they

overcame barriers to fulfil their dreams. They also visited Thornden Woods to consider exploration and had a fabulous time.

Year 3 have worked hard in literacy, drafting letters to send to musical theatre star and children's author, Carrie Hope Fletcher. Once these are written up neatly,

they will be sent to the Marlowe and the children will keep their fingers crossed for a response. The children have also spent some time reflecting on the impact of Rosa Parks on the civil rights movement as part of Black history week. The children have blown their teachers away with their thoughtful contributions to some serious discussions.

On Friday the School Council Representative and the Pupil Leadership Team visited The Guildhall in Canterbury and met the Lord Mayor of Canterbury and the Sherrif. We were so proud of all the children who asked amazing questions and behaved so sensibly.

We ended the week with our celebration assembly, as normal, but this week we had the special prize of 4 tickets to the Marlowe to see the British Astronaut Tim Peake given it
