Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to term 2. I hope you all had a lovely break. I know we all felt refreshed especially with the added few days.

Term 2 is always so magical in a junior school as we head towards (sshhh...Christmas). We have the Year 3 Nativity to look forward to, check the dates in the date list below and keep an eye out for more information to follow. We have a range of other Christmassy activities planned; PTFA Christmas Fair, Christmas Shopping and our fabulous PTFA have generously offered to pay for every single child, who wants one, to have a school Christmas dinner. I will be sending out a letter next week so you can tell us if your child would like one.

We have been showing parents of year 2 children round our lovely school this week and have our school open morning this Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> November. We are really looking forward to sharing all the wonderful things your children get to experience when they join WIS.

Next week is Anti-Bullying week and the children can wear odd socks on Monday to start the week off. The theme this year is Reach Out and we will be exploring how we can all make a difference by being kind and supporting each other. Year 3 have been excellent ambassadors for our school this

week during our Year 2 workshops. We are sure their smiling faces put the Year 2s at ease and made their days brighter. They have also begun Nativity practise, learning lots of new festive songs and finding out their roles!

Year 4 have been busy learning about how to measure the area of a 2D shape and continuing to read 'Hurricane' in literacy which links to their topic of natural disasters. They have also been busy making models of the earth, recreating its layers using coloured clay. In science, they have been on a 'sound hunt' around the school, finding out how sound is produced.

Year 5 have fully embraced Remembrance, looking at the 1914 Christmas Truce and the range of flowers that represent why it is so important to have 2 minutes silence. The children created some beautiful artwork and wrote a powerful recount of a soldier on Christmas Eve 1914. In Maths, they have been investigating factors, multiples, prime numbers and square numbers.

Year 6 have been simplifying fractions and ordering them on a number line, stepping out of the trenches with the war poets Rupert Brooke and Wilfred Owen for Remembrance and taking a journey through time to investigate the origins of the universe in Science. Work has started on their fabulous Mayan masks which promise to be even more stunning than last year's.

On Friday Year 6 joined the remembrance "service" outside the library and the rest of the school held a minute's silence during assembly.
