What have the children been up to this week?

For their first week back, year 3 have been exploring exciting new literary devices, including personification and onomatopoeia using their new text, The Iron Man. They have also started their new history topic - the Indus Valley. The children have been full of great questions pertaining to the topic and it is clear they can't wait to explore it further.



In year 4, the children have started a new book in their literacy lessons about Pompeii, which is linked to their history topic. They have also been tackling factors in maths, using 'factor bugs' to help their understanding. In science, the children have also started a new topic, learning all about the human body and finding out how amazing it is! They had great fun drawing and labelling the human body parts as you can see by this picture!

The children in Year 5 have been exploring whether the world was created randomly or by design. The children went looking for evidence outside and created newspaper reports to see if God was involved in current affairs; this really did create quite a discussion! In literacy, the children launched their Ancient Greeks topic by studying stories about the creation of the world by the Gods and Pandora's box, as well as starting the class reading book: Percy Jackson.

Finally, Year 6 have started reading the amazing book 'Darwin's Dragons'. They have been using a wide range of vocabulary to write diary entries and descriptive paragraphs imagining what it must have been like to be one of the main characters washed up on The Galapagos Islands. Also, as part of their bread making



lessons in DT, they have been exploring how yeast makes bread rise. For science, the children have been recapping what they know about electricity and what they would like to explore more about during the course of the term. The children also completed some Outdoor Learning Lessons, developing their risk taking and precision skills, to make their own tools and wands.

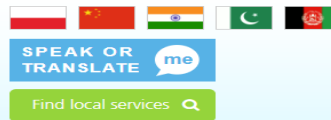


Well Done, such amazing work completed; we are very proud of you!
