What have the children been up to this week?

This week, Year 3 have been archaeologists, newspaper reporters and all-round superstars. In



Literacy, they have created their own Indus Valley pots ready to write a newspaper report about their discovery. In History, they discovered artefacts from the Indus Valley around their classrooms, replicating their real discoveries and using specific questions to discover more about these epic finds.



This week Year 4 have continued learning about the Roman invasion of Britain and they have started designing catapults in DT

ready to make them later in the term; the children will even get the opportunity to test them out! They have also been learning about how the digestive system works and what happens to our food when we chew; eating bread as part of their lesson was such a highlight!

In Year 5, the children have been learning about why it isn't a good idea to fly too close to the sun in our myth, Daedalus and Icarus. In Science, they have investigated friction by looking at the soles of our shoes and why they have different treads. They have also nearly conquered fractions and have started to subtract them this week.



Year 6 have been making delicious bread rolls as part of their DT this week; investigating how different types of flour affect the texture, smell and taste. They

have also been getting into character with some hot-seating and exploring what the life cycle of a dragon could be. Whilst in maths they have used skittles to explore the relationship between ratios and fractions. **Well done everyone, a wonderful week full of great learning experiences!**
