
A message from Mr Cooper and Mrs Roy...

be lots of other exciting reading activities as well as opportunities for the children to


share their favourite stories with other children across the school.

What have the children been up to this week?

In year 3, the children discovered how sound is made and enjoyed exploring different pitches. They have also enjoyed their new topic based on the history of Ancient Egypt, through their intriguing new text: The Egyptian Cinderella!

Year 4 have started a new book called 'Julius Zebra' about the adventures of a zebra during Roman times. They have also been improving their inference skills and tackling abstract nouns and synonyms as part of this learning. In maths, following on from their work on Number Day last term, the children have been calculating perimeter. In R.E. they have started to think about why their lives can be described as a journey and all the exciting events that happen along the way!

In year 5, the children have 'hit the ground running' with fractions; they have been multiplying unit and non-unit fractions by integers. Amazing progress and understanding! They have also learnt about the Trojan war in preparation for writing newspaper reports next week.

Lastly, year 6 have made a start on their Medalling Monarchs topic, creating a timeline of the key rulers that they will be covering. They have also enjoyed completing drama that explores the feelings of the different characters in our book: 'Oranges in No Man's Land'. For Science, the children have been recalling their previous knowledge on light and exploring what they would like to find out more about this term.

Well done everyone on a great start back.
