As you know we have a school council at our school who meet and discuss issues in school and get involved in various projects or organising events. In November, representatives from our school council attended the Coastal Alliance Co-operative Trust Children's Forum.

The aim of the event was to get children involved in contributing to the CACoT Trust Board's future plans by sharing their ideas for how all our schools can work together to support the local community in Whitstable and Herne Bay in these difficult times.

We agreed and voted on some ideas to propose to the Trust Board in January, where three representatives from the forum spoke to the Headteachers and Chairs of Governors present. The board accepted our ideas and some of our local nurseries also agreed to get on board with these ideas too.

So, we need your help with the first one which will help us support our local food banks and in turn those who they support by downloading the app below:

Food banks often struggle with effectively communicating their real time supply and demand needs to their donors. Social media posts or notices in supermarkets, quickly go out of date or go unnoticed and as a result, food banks can be inundated with one item or have little of another. Regularly updating their real time needs to their local community, can be a cumbersome admin task, which takes food bank volunteers away from their crucial work of collecting and distributing food.

BanktheFood hopes to change this through an innovative free app which links food banks to donors at the most crucial time; when donors are at the supermarket. You can then use the app to keep up to date with what Canterbury Food Bank is most in need of! The app is free to use and always will be.
