This term we will be exploring the theme of TRUST- What is trust and how do we show others that we can be trusted?


We will be discussing and reinforcing the key qualities of being trustworthy:

## What have the children been up to this week?

**Year 3** have started looking at our new text, 'The Firework-Maker's Daughter'. We have been experimenting with different magical ingredients to come up with our own exciting firework concoctions, ready to write instructions. In French, we have been securing our knowledge of the numbers I-10 by singing songs and playing 'snap'.





They have also been tackling equivalent fractions in maths and continuing to practise their times tables. In science, the children have started learning about 'living things' and how to group them into categories. In **Year 5** we have launched the Viking ships this week with their investigations into Men and Women of this time. They have written amazing setting descriptions of a Viking town and explored the Viking belief of Valhalla. In Science, the children have been revising their previous Changing States knowledge by Escaping from a kitchen using codes linked to evaporation, filtering, solids, liquids, gases etc... In our Outdoor learning, the children have been practicing their first aid skills and making sure they know what the recovery position is. **Year 6** enjoyed a fabulous sporting afternoon on Wednesday, run by the PE department and 6<sup>th</sup> form pupils from The Whitstable school. The children had so much fun developing their team work skills as they completed various activities designed by the 6<sup>th</sup> form pupils, all based around different elements of bench ball. A lovely start to their transition journey.
