Dear parents and carers,





What have the children been up to this week?

This week Year 3 have enjoyed delving further into their text 'The Firework-Maker's Daughter,' reaching dramatic scenes seeing their main characters enter the final part of their journey. To describe these scenes children were tasked with using Thesauruses to up level their vocabulary and wowed their teachers with their careful word choices. In D.T they planned the sandwich they will create next week - challenging themselves to include all five food groups! This week in Year 4 the children have continued reading 'The Magic Paintbrush' and written wonderful descriptions of the cruel Emperor, as well as thinking about who their 'spirit animal' would be. In art, the children have also

enjoyed painting their beautiful willow patterned plates, linking their art to their topic work. In outdoor learning, Mrs. Grier taught the children basic first aid skills to keep them safe. Another amazing week! In Science, Year 5 have been investigating the irreversible change in the process of rusting. They have also looked at Danegeld in Viking times, where the King paid the Vikings to leave them alone. They read the poem written by Rudyard Kipling and discussed that this was a tertiary source of evidence. In Maths they have been investigating measuring and drawing angles while also looking at what jobs might use angles.

In the afternoons, they have investigated the workings of the human heart in science, the importance of vaccination in Relationships Education and ancient forms of crime and punishment in History. 
