


# Whitstable Junior School Learning today for life tomorrow



### What have the children been up to this week?

Year 3 have enjoyed bringing their science topic to life this week by planting cress seeds, ready to apply their learning to see if they can make them grow. In Literacy, they finished their text 'Ottoline and the Yellow Cat' and reflected on how the characters had changed through descriptive writing. This week Year 4 have been looking at Grandpa's Garden and rewriting the story from the perspective of an earthworm. In maths they have been converting money from pounds to pence. They are very excited about which materials conducted electricity to light up a bulb. This week, Year 5 have continued their research and informative writing all about Rye; they have learnt lots of facts about the flora, fauna and historical attractions that Rye has to offer. In Maths, they have been adding and subtracting decimals using a range of strategies. Linking to literacy, in Geography we have been comparing physical and human features of Rye and Whitstable. 
- Not enough teachers
