What have the children been up to this week?

This week Year 3 enjoyed their Beaney trip! They travelled on our school minibuses and headed into Canterbury to learn about prehistoric people. They were able to handle real artefacts, including arrowheads and created their own cave paintings using charcoal! They were super stars and their curiosity shone throughout. Year 4 have been on a terrifying trip through the Wild Wood with Mole, thankfully finding Badger's home eventually. They have been rounding to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000 in maths and exploring the ways in which gasses are formed in science. In football, they have been practicing attacking skills and have been creating calendars in computing. Year 5 have had a busy time this week. On Monday, they were visited by two members of Canterbury Mosque to talk about the Year 5 RE big question. The children have also visited Whitstable library where they had a great time browsing the books and learning about the Dewey system of organising non-fiction books. In English lessons, the children have continued their study of Flotsam; writing letters from some of the children in the photographs. Maths has included rounding numbers within 1 million. In English this week, Year 6 have been learning the challenging rules of punctuating speech and how to use figurative language to make their writing more colourful. In maths, they have been finding prime, square and cubed numbers and are now moving on to the revision of long multiplication with four digit by two digit numbers. In science they have peered through the microscope at microscopic organisms and focus upon mould! In geography, trade links with the rainforest have been discussed and their advantages and disadvantages.




Times Table Fact of the Week
