## What have the children been up to this week?

This week Year 3 had a brilliant time in their photography work shop, learning how to take photographs and getting the opportunity to take their own photos outside using digital cameras. In English they have been reading 'Where the Wild Things Are,' and using their inference skills to make predictions about the text as well as using time adverbials to order the events of the story. In maths the children have moved on from addition and are now tackling subtraction with exchanging. In science they have been recapping all their knowledge of rocks and soils, proving themselves to be quiz masters! Year 4 had the chance to explore a real river during our wonderful trip to Canterbury. They were delighted to find lots of links to their story - Wind in the Willows too. During English, they have been practicing using speech marks ready to complete a story: the further adventures of Mr Toad. In maths they have moved onto addition and subtraction and have enjoyed studying the festival of Diwali in RE. Year 5 have had a busy week finishing their persuasive letters to companies about plastic pollution and there have been several eco-warriors emerging who will change the world! In maths it has been problem solving time looking at multi-step problems for addition and subtraction. Furthermore, the children have taken part in a wonderful photography workshop and learnt all about cameras. As part of Mental Health Day on Tuesday, the children learnt about taking care of both their physical and mental health and the importance in moving, sleeping and eating well to help maintain these. Lastly, Year 6 have been continuing their information texts which are full of fascinating facts about rainforest animals. Did you know that sloths have to do a 'poo dance'? They are rounding off their writing with a glossary of terms. In maths they have been continuing with the challenging task of long division and learning how to convert their understanding to problem solving with division. It was 'breadtastic' in science as the children devised ways to explore the growth of mould on bread and placed their bread in various places around school. 6M have conducted a thorough beach clean and 6H made 5-point scales to recognise emotions for World Mental Health Week.
