# What have the children been up to this week?

This week Year 3 have enjoyed practising more of their Nativity 'The Bells Ring Out.' They have even completed their first full run through with all the songs and narrations! The children are total superstars and we can't wait to welcome you to see their performances. The children have also enjoyed reading more of their text 'The Iron Man' and have been describing the characters' emotions as they progress throughout the text. Year 4 have learnt all about Taoism for Inter Faith week, exploring the key beliefs and accompanying lantern festival. In English, they have been creating detailed explanation texts on how volcanoes erupt and have continued to consolidate their understanding of multiplication in maths. Year 5 have had a wonderful interfaith week learning about Bahá'i faith and were very lucky to have some visitors share some fascinating information through dance and song. In English we have been looking at settings and creating their Viking characters for their Sagas next week. This week has also seen the start of our fractions journey. The children have been looking at unit and non-unit fractions and finding equivalents for both! They have been working hard in PE to develop their gymnastic balances and travelling both individually and with a partner. This week Year 6 have been learning how to multiply and divide fractions in maths using a range of strategies, both visual and abstract. In English, they have been continuing with their virtual reality adventures which have taken them on many twists and turns in an effort to return to the safety of their own homes. They have focused on skills such as relative clauses, show not tell and the use of precise vocabulary for meaning. History involved looking at primary evidence and analysing uses and materials for archaeological finds. For Inter Faith Week they have been learning about Sikhism and the Sikh Diwali and building lanterns from salt dough and paper to carry to our own mini festival of light on Friday.





#### Head lice - Let's blitz the nits!

Please check your children regularly. Although some products kill headlice, crucially they do not kill the eggs. The eggs take between 7 – 11 days to hatch and often can't be seen if freshly laid. A good combing schedule would be to comb on days 1, 2, 6, 9 and 12 to blitz all nits and eggs. Expensive products don't have to be used; tea tree conditioner can be effective. Let's all work together and eliminate the current infestation.
