At WJS we know how important working in partnership with parents is. To this end, I sent out a parent survey to our newest parents. Thank you to those who completed the survey. Your responses will be really helpful in shaping future practice. Below is a summary of responses: -

17 / 60 parents responded. (28%)

I. Was WJS your first choice?

Yes 100%

2. Did you find the virtual tour and physical tour helpful in making your decision?

Yes: 15/17 88% No: 2/17 18%

3. What information did you find particularly useful?

Seeing the whole school including the well-being and SEN offer and meeting the teachers. Getting a feel for the ethos of the school.

4. Any suggestions?

5. Why did you choose WJS?

Responses indicated you loved the warm, friendly, supportive ethos of the school and the rounded education pupils receive. As well as the space we have.

6. Did you find the open morning useful?

7. We had a meet the teacher session in week 2. How was this useful?

Majority felt this was both important and useful as it gave a chance to see how children were settling in and to establish a relationship with your child's teacher. Some said the time was not convenient.

9. Any further suggestions / comments?

Many expressed appreciation for the support children have received to help them settle at WJS and that you feel this is definitely the right school for your child. A few said they would have liked the opportunity to let us know about friendship groups and for us to consider further information we get from the Infant schools to assist with class groupings in relation to friendships. One parent said their child struggled with the change in expectations/more structured approach to learning.

We have already started to action some of the points raised:

During recent tours we explained what a day at WJS looks like as well as show casing enrichment opportunities and clubs. I am continuing to build on developing partnership with our feeder schools to ensure we have an excellent understanding of what the educational experience will be for our Year 3 pupils, as well as ensuring groupings of children is given optimum thought. We will provide information to all parents and children about our club offer – both at lunchtime and after school.

What have the children been up to this week?


This week in **Year 3** the children have continued reading Iron Man and used persuasive and descriptive language in their writing. They have also been brilliant mathematicians revising column addition and subtraction with exchanging. In preparation for the Nativity performance next week, the children have also been learning all the beautiful songs and getting excited about their costumes! **Year 4** have started their fantastic new English unit all about performing poetry. They have explored expression and dynamics and demonstrated their new skills with aplomb! In maths, they have been revising some of the topics we have studied so far this year, looking particularly at rounding and multiples. In geography they have learnt all about earthquakes and have continued coding in computing. **Year 5** have prepared for their Viking Saga writing Character descriptions and Settings that they can use looking at similes and metaphors as well as show not tell. In maths, the children have cracked converting between mixed numbers to improper fractions with the use of diagrams. As it is already that time of year, the children have been showing their community spirit this week by making Christmas cards for local people. This week in English **Year 6** have explored WWI poetry comparing the poems of Rupert Brooke and Wilfred Owen. In maths they have concluded their fractions work with finding fractions of amounts. In science the children have played a game of chance to show the process of natural selection and learnt about the Rock Pocket Mouse and its mutations.
