


# What have the children been up to this week?

This week in Year 3 children have been very excited about performing the nativity to the rest of the school and to their grownups. They have been trying on their costumes, practising the beautiful songs and working really hard at being wonderful performers! Year 4 have spent their time recapping subtraction skills in maths, writing some amazing poetry in English and have been merrily singing Christmas songs too for music. In geography they have learnt all about terrifying tornadoes and how they are formed and have explored the vibrant world of Hindu weddings. Year 5 have been starting their work on adding and subtracting fractions in maths. They have been writing their amazing Viking Sagas and in art they have been continuing to develop their understanding of lines. As the festive season has started, Year 5 enjoyed their Christmas dinner and later watching the Year 3 Nativity. This week, Year 6 have been writing WWI poetry using figurative language to fully portray both the glory and the horrors of trench warfare. In maths, they have used units of measure to calculate mass, capacity and length. In science, Darwin's finches were the source of an experiment into adaptation of beaks on birds in order to best fit their food source.

**RE:** Winter Wellness: A Reminder for Parents. As we approach the end of Term 2, it's crucial to consider the inevitable occurrence of common colds and coughs, especially during the winter season. Your child's health and well-being are paramount and we want to provide you with essential information to help make informed decisions regarding their attendance.

**Common Guidelines:** Refer to government guidelines at GOV.UK for managing specific infectious diseases. Notify the school **every day** if your child is unwell, providing a reason for their absence. Medical evidence may be required depending on length and frequency of illnesses. Examples of evidence that could be used are prescriptions, doctors' appointments or letters.

Additional Information from the Department for Education (DfE): Mild respiratory illnesses are usually acceptable for school attendance, including minor/moderate coughs, runny noses or sore throats. Children should not attend school with a temperature of above 38°C. Help to address mental health concerns by promoting school attendance; being in school can help alleviate underlying issues. We will support this and help students to learn skills in regulating.
