#### Dear Parents/carers

The children have enjoyed starting clubs this week with 91 children attending at least one club. We believe we have an amazing club offer at WJS. Evidence shows that attending school clubs impacts both on children's academic and emotional development. Clubs can provide motivation for children who may find school more challenging; it enables children to spend some less structured time with our teaching staff thus building positive relationships as well as developing a firm sense of belonging to our school community. Extracurricular provision can promote a range of specific benefits including enhanced confidence, resilience, relationships, and social and emotional intelligence. Developing this provision is a key objective on our school plan this year where we aim for ALL children to attend at least one club during the year.

Our club offer is carefully mapped out in consultation with the children to ensure we have something for everyone. Additionally, the school funds all school run clubs to ensure equality of access. Some of our paid for clubs offer free places for our Pupil Premium families, which we are looking at increasing. There are still places on the following clubs:- upper school netball, whole school eco, upper school change for life, upper school multi sports and whole school dance . 
## What have the children been up to this week?

This week **Year 3** have revisited their learning from last term by taking a trip to France through their fantastic non-chronological reports they have written. They have particularly enjoyed learning all about the food you can enjoy there! In Dance, they have been working in teams to replicate movement inspired by machinery, learning the count of 8 as they go. Year 4 have been honing their English skills by reviewing how to properly punctuate speech and improving their writing by using exciting ISPACE openers. In maths we have been multiplying and dividing by 10 and 100, spotting patterns and coming up with strategies to be able to do this quickly. We have learned about the journey our food goes on in our digestive system in science and have thoughtfully discussed the role of the ten commandments in Judaism as part of our RE learning. Year 5 have had a busy week learning all about Theseus and the Minotaur through descriptive writing and how to use speech marks. Can your children remember the rules of speech punctuation? In history, the children have used primary sources of evidence to investigate the different sports from the Ancient Greek Olympics and compared them with their experiences of modern Olympics. In science the children have crashing cars to explore the effects of forces and gravity as we start our new topic of forces. In RE, the children have looked at Jesus' mission statement and how this influenced his church. Finally, year 5 are taking a pause in fractions after successfully mastering mixed number addition and subtraction. This week, **Year 6** have used hyphenated words to describe a deadly giant centipede and language of comparison to discuss little Farthing's similarity to a dog in their English lessons. In Maths, they have begun working with decimals, focusing on place value to begin with. The children continue to construct working circuits in science using the correct symbols to convey them as diagrams. They have also learned about the different biomes in South America in geography.
