


What have the children been up to this week?

This week in Year 3 the children have had a brilliant book week learning about migration and taking part in lots of learning related activities including painting their own pebbles! They have also enjoyed an incredible Ancient Egyptian workshop, enjoyed face painting, dressing up and learning lots more fascinating facts about Egypt. Year 4 have been learning all about refugees and focusing on the skill of empathy. We were also transported to Japan with some fantastic workshops all about Japanese culture completing Japanese calligraphy, origami and learning some of the language. We also had the chance to visit the library which was a wonderful part of our week and so much fun to be immersed in all of their brilliant books. In cooking, we continued to learn about seasonal food and focused specifically on why vegetables are so important in our diet and why we must eat lots of them. Year 5 have had a fabulous Book Week learning about Kunkush the Cat and his adventures as well as what being a refugee and asylum seeker means (not a silence seeker like our book thought it was.) The children have produced fabulous posters, letters and diary entries around these books and really enjoyed their visit to the library. In maths the children became confident with equivalent fractions and decimals for tenths and hundredths. Also, this week in D&T, the children used their chopping, wilting and whisking skills to create a feta and spinach filo parcel like a traditional Greek Pie. Year 6 have been analysing the book 'The Island' by Armin Greder and using their writing and empathy skills to explore the experiences of refugees. In maths they have been revising short and long division methods. In science, they have been looking at the working of the human eye and they have charted the many marriages of Henry VIII in history. The children are building their sketching skills in anticipation of their final portrait of a Tudor royal - this week was perspective with drawing noses.










Times Table Fact of the Week
