Wishing our whole school community, a happy and peaceful Easter,




What have the children been up to this week?

This week in **Year 3** the children have enjoyed making posters as part of their learning about 'Time' in science week. They have also been thinking about neurodiversity and how it feels to manage day to day tasks if you are neurodiverse. In English the children have been brushing up their SPaG skills, ready for some amazing writing in Term 5 and comparing capacity and volume in maths. They also enjoyed making seed bombs in Outdoor Learning and are looking forward to watching their flowers grow! **Year 4** have continued to write their take on a Chinese myth in English, describing in detail how their valiant heroes save the day by using some fantastic adjectives, adverbs and fronted adverbials. In maths we have built on our fractions knowledge, incorporating mixed numbers into our addition and subtraction problems. During RE we thought about what makes a good teacher and how Jesus used parables to teach his followers. As part of our topic on Modern China, in geography we delegated roles within a team to research different cultural aspects before bringing our knowledge together. This week, **Year 5** have been celebrating their amazing Greek knowledge by hosting a wonderful Greek museum. Furthermore, the children have

been writing a balanced argument based on a philosophical question from the Odyssey of whether they would rather be a Happy Pig or an Unhappy Man. During maths the children have been finding the perimeter of rectilinear shapes. **Year 6** have been exploring the grim punishments for different crimes during the Tudor period. They have also been stepping into a character's shoes and recalling events from their point of view as part of our continuing work on 'Oranges in No Man's Land'. In maths they have been revising calculations using decimal numbers and fractions and in art they have been creating detailed portraits of monarchs.




