Dear parents/carers

Welcome back to term 5, I hope you all had a great Easter break and enjoyed the few days of spring sunshine we managed to get!

The children have all come back beautifully this week and settled back into learning well. Years 4 and 5 kicked off the term with virtual workshops on Monday. Year 4 were consolidating their learning about China and for year 5 the workshop provided a 'hook' into their new topic – Space.

On Tuesday we celebrated Jess Brown's life. I was so proud of the year 5 pupils who attended the Celebration of Life service and the compassion, resilience and kindness they showed. Thank you to everyone who supported our 'wear a hat day' to raise money for brain cancer research – we raised £123.58.

This term, our Year 3 and 4 pupils have swimming lessons. Thank you to all of you who have ensured the children are prepared for these sessions. These are curriculum lessons and the expectation is for all children to attend. We understand that some children may require additional support to make this happen which we will provide to ensure children have equal access to our curriculum. Living so close to the sea, learning to swim is a key skill we aim for all children to achieve during their time with us.

We are sad to say goodbye to our school cook Tammy. We wish Tammy all the best in all her new adventures; she will be greatly missed.

What have the children been up to this week?

This week in Year 3, the children have started a wonderful new book called 'Ottoline and the Yellow Cat' in English and have become literary detectives, making inferences and predictions from the text. They have also been learning to add and subtract fractions and have proved to be brilliant mathematicians, remembering what the numerator and the denominator are! In science, the children have started a new topic, learning all about food groups and healthy eating. Year 4 have begun Term 5 by reading 'Escape from Pompeii' and using their figurative language to bring the events and aftermath of this devastating natural disaster to life. In maths they have been using last term's understanding of fractions to support them in recognising the equivalent decimals. As part of our new topic on the Romans, in history they have been discovering who these people were and how they built their empire. At the beginning of the week, they also enjoyed a VR Headset workshop reviewing all their previous learning on China and impressed us with their confidence in their first swimming lesson: they'll sleep well this weekend! Year 5 this week have rocketed into Outer Space with their VR Headset experience and looked into different people who worked on space expeditions:- Mary Jackson, Gwynne Shotwell and Helen Sharman. In maths, the children have been mastering area and perimeter of compound shapes and in PE the children have started cricket looking at fielding and passing. Year 6 have been piecing together the elements needed to provide a balanced argument ahead of their Great Debate about Henry VIII. In maths, time has been the focus with the children converting between units of time, finding time differences and analysing timetables. In Art, they have started looking at Pop Art and the work of Roy Lichtenstein.








