What have the children been up to this week?

This week in **Year 3** the children have enjoyed reading Ottoline and the Yellow Cat, acting out their predictions for what will happen next and learning how to use inverted commas correctly. In maths, they have started working out problems using amounts of money and have even run their own shop! The children have also continued to learn about healthy eating and in D.T. tasted different types of bread ahead of their sandwich making! In English **Year 4** have been planning a newspaper report on the eruption of Mount Vesuvius; the children have enjoyed exploring the events that unfolded and taking part in a hot seating activity to polish up their interviewing skills, ready to pen their reports next week. In science we have been thinking about the types of electricity that power the appliances in our homes and whether they are mains or battery powered. Year 4 also greatly enjoyed their visit from Dogs **Trust**. The interactive session taught us lots about how to be safe and kind around dogs.

Year 5 have been researching their non-chronological reports about planets and discovering lots of facts. They have also been exploring all 23 countries in North America. Wonder how many they could name? Furthermore, they have delved deeper into research mode looking at line graphs and interpreting information from them in maths. Year 5 really enjoyed their visit from DogsTrust and in music they loved creating their own piece about a planet. Year 6 children have been investigating area and perimeter of 2D shapes for their maths. In English, they have broken down the features of a balanced argument and started to gather evidence both for and against Henry VIII as a good king. In art, they looked at the artist Rosalyn Drexler and produced some paintings with collage that reflected her style. They were lucky enough to be visited by DogsTrust who taught them how to treat dogs with care and respect.
