Every Child Matters

Whitstable Junior School is an inclusive school where each child is valued and encouraged to achieve their very best. We have an extremely caring staff team who work hard to ensure that all children receive high quality personalised teaching through excellent targeted classroom teaching. We help each child to develop a love of learning and the confidence to try.

Progress is closely monitored by all staff and detailed guidance is given to each child to help them improve their learning and to know their next steps.

We have an inclusive approach to meeting the needs of all children including those with Special Educational Needs and/or Disabilities (SEND).

At Whitstable Junior School we understand that an important feature of the school is to enable all children to develop emotional resilience and social skills, both indirectly and through direct teaching.

We have a very successful well-being team in place working throughout the school. The aim of the team is to support children in their social and emotional development. We have been awarded SILVER status in the Carnegie Mental Health in Schools Award and we are immensely proud of this.

Our Learning Environment



Whitstable Junior School is a town school with a difference. We have a fabulous school site which enables our children to learn inside and outside, enjoying extended learning opportunities.

We have our “micro-forest school” area, with outside classroom, pond, timber-trail and “mud-lab”. We provide opportunities for outdoor learning wherever we can as we know how much this helps to engage children and secure their learning in a memorable way.

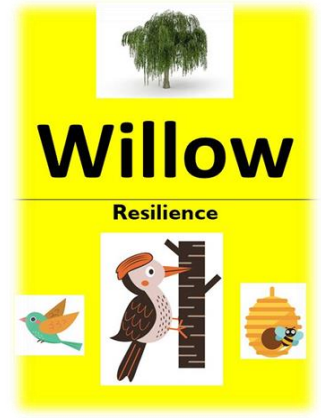
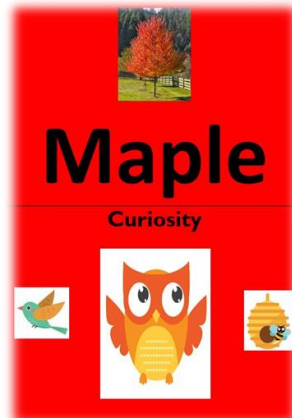
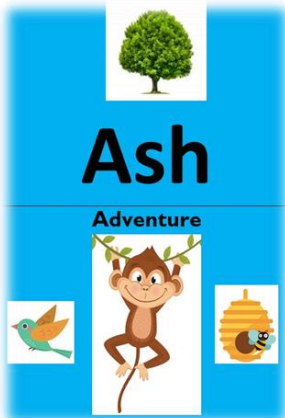
Our outside facilities include a new artificial grass multi-sports pitch, with short tennis courts and full football pitch. Our playground space is also large enough for 2 netball courts and an exciting clamber stack for the children to have adventures on.

We have a well-equipped library and Computing Suite which all of our children use each week, plus a bank of lap-tops, chrome-books and mini devices that are available for classroom use. Each classroom space has an interactive whiteboard to aid teaching and learning.
